

LOCATION OF COURSE

CAVEATS REGARDING MEDICAL EXEMPTIONS

OF "ILLEGAL DRUGS"

DR. ELDON TUNKS:

Aims and Learning Objectives:

A brief history of marijuana use and current public usage will be followed by a discussion of possible guidelines for exemption. The grey area of medical liability has not been tested, and there are several areas in which medical practitioners may be exposed.

Problems may occur in situations in which individuals divert the cannabis to children and others, cases in which drug interactions may occur, in cases of genetic defect in which claims may be made against the prescriber, and cases in which psychomotor impairment and risk of accidents may occur.

These situations are complicated by the fact that cannabis despite being legalized, or medicalized, is not officially recognized as a drug, and Colleges of Pharmacy do not have regulatory authority, risk-benefit and long-range toxicity are not monitored, and quality control, adulteration, and the distribution are not monitored, and because of lack of pharmaceutical house ownership, drug trials are not conducted.

Exposure to medical legal risk also extends to the possibility of class action suits, even though this has not been yet tested.

After participating in this event, clinicians will be better able to assess requests for cannabis, and discussion of how to combine cannabis use into a monitored comprehensive treatment strategy.
