 Identify common and important pain disorders including the pain mechanisms underlying the clinical features, and correlate this with the current evidence on pain mechanisms.

AS AN EXPERT:

- 1. To conduct a bedside examination to distinguish primary nociception from chronic hyperalgesic or neuropathic pain conditions.
- 2. Identify through the history, review of documentary data and bedside examination, the conditions, comorbidities and syndromes, preparatory for effective pain management decisions.
